Prior to 2006, the PERS and TRS systems were administered as "[Defined Benefit](#)" (DB) programs ([PERS Tier I-III](#)) and ([TRS Tier I-II](#)). During their working careers, DB retirees paid into the system every pay period, and in addition, the system earns investment income. The Defined Benefit system relies on state appropriations to fund the unfunded liability as determined by the [Alaska Retirement Management Board](#) (ARMB).

Since 2006, new hires do not have Defined Benefits but are placed in the [Defined Contribution Retirement Plan](#), similar to a 401-k. The new retirement tiers ([PERS Tier IV](#) and [TRS Tier III](#)) are causing recruitment and retention problems across the state affecting state agencies, local governments, school districts, and the University. The lack of a Defined Benefit program will likely cause retirement insecurity for public

With a combination of financing that utilized the POMV and high oil prices, the State's FY 2023 Budget was balanced for the first time since 2013 without using savings. However, a notice from the Department of Revenue published September 19th warns of the volatility associated with petroleum revenues and projects the average annual price to drop by the end of the fiscal year, a change by more than 10% of what was expected.
